**Identity management** of health information as part of the digitalisation of public services








# The European Data Strategy (2020)

'Path to Digital Decade 2030' envisages a transformation of society and economy across the EU European Health Data Space (EHDS) is the first EU sectoral data space regulation

# The European Data Strategy (2020)

'Path to Digital Decade 2030' - transformation of society and economy across the EU European Health Data Space (EHDS) will be the first EU sectoral data space and regulation with direct effect

# Key Provisions in the Health Information Bill

- A legal framework for the development of digital health records in Ireland.
- A 'duty to share' health information for care and treatment as well as secondary purposes, spanning public, private and voluntary settings.
- Patient access to their digital health records: national patient summary and shared care record.
- Health information to be collected, shared, linked, and made available for policy-making, research, public health, enhanced health service planning and management.
- A national health data access body to connectt with the EHDS infrastructure.
- Emphasis on strong governance rules for privacy, security and building public trust.
- A National Consultative Forum for health information and National Health Information Guardian.



# Features of European Health Data Space


To build a common **governance and infrastructure framework** for the movement of electronic health information and **empower individuals** with increased digital access and control of their personal health data



# Healthdata@EU pilot infrastructure and use cases

- Demonstrate the feasibility of using the EHDS to carry out infectious disease surveillance, focusing on antimicrobial resistance (European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control)
- Foster a better understanding of the risks of thrombosis in COVID-19 patients (European Medicines Agency)
- Compare COVID-19 testing, vaccination and hospitalisation between the general population and vulnerable subpopulations (Sciensano - Belgium)
- Compare care pathways for cardiometabolic diseases in European countries and build prediction models, using artificial intelligence (Health Data Hub - France)
- Mobilise and chain clinical and genomic data to enhance our understanding of colorectal cancer (ELIXIR)

### HealthData@EU infrastructure and services


- EU4Health Joint Actions for national gap analysis and data quality and utility labelling of national datasets
