# eHealth Away Day Welcome and Update from Fran Thompson, CIO eHealth HSE

On March 4th, 2024, Fran Thompson, Chief Information Officer, eHealth HSE kicked off the eHealth Away Day by introducing a video from the CEO, who could not attend due to other diary commitments. He then introduced Damien McCallion, our new Chief Technology and Transformation Officer CTTO, to the audience. Damien outlined the importance of eHealth in the HSE and its role in the transformation agenda. He outlined that he is really looking forward to leading the division.


Fran began by highlighting the vast array of complex projects in progress, both in development and operational phases. Among these are initiatives such as eOrdering, Single Sign-On and the National Transfer System, which operate quietly but significantly impact people's lives. Notable achievements include the successful implementation of Electronic Health Records (EHRs) at various healthcare facilities, enhancing efficiency and patient care.

On the community side, initiatives like the Disability Case Management solution are underway, aiming to support vulnerable people. Furthermore, Fran mentioned the challenges faced by the IFMS on the corporate side but expressed optimism about its improved position moving forward, thanks to additional funding. He also highlighted the upcoming launch of the HSE App and the transformative potential of the shared care record in changing our approach to patient care.

Fran added insights into significant ongoing initiatives, such as the vaccine system's expansion to integrate COVID and flu vaccine information from GPs, and the development of the Digital Health Strategy and Digital Health & Social Care Framework. These frameworks prioritise patient empowerment, digital workforce enablement, and data-driven decisionmaking to enhance care delivery.



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The Digital Health Strategy framework has 1 vision, 6 principles and 48 initiatives. The six guiding principles, each aimed at enhancing patient engagement, workforce empowerment.

By placing patients at the centre and leveraging digital solutions, eHealth aims to create a seamless and data-driven healthcare ecosystem. Fran emphasised again, the need for comprehensive data management to enable informed decision-making and improve patient outcomes.

Looking ahead, eHealth is committed to rolling out several initiatives over the coming years. Despite inevitable challenges, eHealth remains dedicated to fostering collaboration and innovation within the Health Service Executive. Fran emphasised the importance of teamwork in achieving the organisation's goals and urged the teams to embrace change and find fulfilment in their work.

In conclusion, Fran expressed gratitude to the eHealth teams for their dedication and professionalism. The message was clear: eHealth is on a mission to redefine healthcare delivery through technology, and with the collective effort of its teams, it's poised to make a significant impact on healthcare outcomes.



# **Shaping the future of eHealth:** Insights from Michael Redmond, COO of eHealth HSE

Michael Redmond, the Chief Operating Officer at eHealth HSE, took the opportunity to address the large audience, sharing updates and insights on the ongoing discussions and progress towards the structural design of eHealth services in the context of regionalisation.

Michael emphasised the evolving nature of eHealth's top-level structural design, acknowledging that decisions are still in the works and nothing is set in stone. He underscored the commitment of the leadership team to keep the organisation informed and engaged in the process, aligning with the strategic roadmap for technological and transformational advancements in healthcare delivery.

The discussion pivoted towards the significance of business-led transformation in delivering a connected healthcare system. He highlighted the role of the newly appointed Chief Technology and Transformation Officer (CTTO), Damian McCallion, and the formation of the Technology and Transformation Committee, signalling a shift in emphasis towards aligning technology with business objectives.

Addressing concerns about organisational changes, Michael reassured the audience that eHealth remains a crucial entity, albeit with potential reorganisation and devolution of certain functions to regional centres. He acknowledged the challenge of adapting to new roles and structures but stressed the importance of aligning with the overarching strategic vision.

Looking ahead, Michael outlined the next steps, including the commissioning of an operating model to facilitate seamless transition and delineate responsibilities and accountabilities between central and regional entities.

In conclusion, Michael reiterated the dynamic nature of organisational evolution, emphasising the importance of continuous updates and transparency in driving forward the eHealth agenda. As the organisation moves towards regionalisation and embraces technological advancements, collaboration and adaptability remain paramount in shaping the future of healthcare delivery in Ireland.

The show stopping pièces de résistance came when Tim conversed with a virtual version of our CIO Fran Thompson on stage, built by leveraging a range of AI and GenAI tools.

Tim Morthorst an expert in Artificial Intelligence (AI) presented on the future of AI as it is poised to revolutionise healthcare. Tim spoke about the possibilities of Personalised Treatment Plans, the ability of AI to analyse vast datasets and identify patterns and correlations within genetic information. How machine learning algorithms can sift through complex medical information, including images, lab results, and patient histories, to identify subtle patterns and anomalies that may escape the human eye.





Tim also described how in addition to Al's clinical applications, it could streamline administrative processes within healthcare. How automated systems powered by AI could handle tasks such as appointment scheduling, billing, and data entry, freeing up valuable time for healthcare professionals to focus

on patient care. Not only increases operational efficiency but also reduces the likelihood of errors associated with manual data handling.

Tim acknowledged that despite the vast promises of AI in healthcare there are ethical considerations and challenges. Issues such as data privacy, bias in So, eHealth it looks like Welcome To The Future! 

# **HR & Payroll Business Support**

Our last article on SAP CoE was back in February 2023 when we featured SAP CoE Business Delivery – Finance & Procurement with SAP CoE General Manager, Sean Duffy. This month we will take a look at the SAP CoE HR & Payroll Business Support Team with newly appointed General Manager, Niall McMahon (photographed below).




Niall was appointed as General Manager for the SAP CoE HR & Payroll Business Support unit in July 2023. Prior to his appointment he worked for several years with SAP CoE as a Senior Project Manager, most recently as SAP CoE Lead for the NiSRP programme. Niall is pleased to take up this role and looks forward to the challenges of this Business Support function within SAP CoE.

Commenting on the work of SAP CoE, Niall noted that the HR & Payroll Business Support team provides Level 1 and Level 2 support to over 7,000 SAP HR/PY users in the HSE and across the Section 38's. At Level 1 support we have a dedicated team of Helpdesk Analysts who monitor, manage and dispatch all HR & Payroll related Business Desk calls logged by users on Weblog (the SAP CoE HR and Payroll issues management system). Any issues which can't be resolved at Level 1 are escalated to Level 2 for further analysis and assessment by a team of Functional Analysts who have specific expertise in the SAP HR/PY modules. The analyst may advise the end user of a workaround or suggest further training. If the issue requires a configuration change, it is fully assessed with our Technical Implementation Partner. If approved, changes are made, tested and applied to production system.

In addition to providing Level 1 and 2 support we also have a remit to progress any relevant HSE circulars and Legislative changes that require a change to the SAP HR & Payroll system. An example of some of these changes include New Grade Code Configuration, revised contractual arrangements for groups of staff, changes to the Sick Leave Schemes and implementation of pay awards.

Typically these are complex changes which require significant configuration and testing prior to their application to the production system.

Looking back at 2023, it was a busy year for SAP CoE. Our customer base has




increased with the on boarding of the South West employees and increased requests from existing users. In addition we also receive technical queries for HSE HR & Payroll Self Service - the volume of which has increased as Self Service is rolled out to the majority of HSE areas at this stage.

Last year over 17,500 Business Desk calls (Level 1) were raised with the team, a 12% increase on the previous year. These translated into over 5,000 Level 2 calls and 1,900 configuration changes to the system.

2024 is shaping up to be another eventful year with further roll out of the SAP HR/ PY system in the West together with further legislative changes and requests for additional functionality in the system already being flagged to us by our user base since the start of the year.

In a future newsletter we will focus on the SAP CoE Customer Experience Team, headed up by Geraldine Kilkenny, managing the level 1 Help Desk tickets for the recently implemented IFMS system.




